Any neat double-spaced copy with comfortable margins is considered acceptable form for the manuscript. Although ribbon copy is prefered, there is no objection to legible duplicated copies; $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" sheets are preferable but not mandatory. An abstract of the article should appear on the first page of the manuscript.

Executive Committee Meeting March 9, 1970 Airport Hotel, Pittsburgh, Pa.

1) The meeting was called to order at 11:00 a.m. Executive Committee present: H. Markovitz, R. R. Myers, R. Coulehan, E. A. Collins, J. L. White, J. C. Miller. Others present: A. P. Metzger.

2) The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as distributed by mail.

3) The secretary reported that a safety deposit box had been rented to store a Treasury note which supplies income for the Bingham Medal.

4) A request from Biosciences Information Service for a complimentary copy of the Transactions for abstracting was turned down.

5) The Rules changes that were submitted to the membership last fall for ratification were passed by a large margin.

6) The Treasurer, R. E. Coulehan reported that the 1969 financial report was presently being done. It is expected that financial statements will be done by computer at the end of 1970 with a substantial improvement in timeliness of the reports.

7) The Editor, R. R. Myers has found that the transactions are limited to 600 pages per year by Interscience. On this basis, there are enough papers accepted to complete Volume 14. Discussion of a double track system for manuscripts with payment of pages charges favored in publication resulted in decision to set up such a system because of the declining number of authors paying the charges.

8) A committee which consists of F. R. Eirich, R. R. Myers, and J. C. Miller was instructed to investigate with Interscience the problems associated with the publication of the Transactions.

9) A more up-to-date list of the number of authors who are paying the page charges is necessary to assess our financial status on a more current basis. The Secretary will try to obtain more current information from AIP or Interscience.

10) The Treasurer reported a surplus of \$487 for the St. Paul meeting.

11) The Winter meeting at Cal Tech was successful with 24 papers presented and approximately 70 registrants.

P. Metzger. A lecture on fracture mechanics will be presented by S. S. Sternstein. An invited lecturer in applied rheology is being sought. It was recommended that publicity about the meeting be sent to as many journals as possible.

13) The quality of slides used at the technical meetings has been uneven. To improve the readability of slides, the program chairman will send out a recommendation on the preparation of slides.

14) An invitation to hold a Winter meeting in Salt Lake City was tabled because of objections by the West Coast. The decision on the West Coast site will be turned over to the West Coast representatives.

15) An instrument exhibition will be held at the 1971 meeting at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville. The President will appoint a committee to investigate the possibility of a short course to be held before or after the meeting on a subject of interest to rheologists.

16) The meeting in 1972 may conflict with the International Meeting and no decision about the 1972 meeting will be made until this Fall.

17) An offer by Rheologica Acta to give a discount to Society members was turned down because we would have to become a participating society. The executive committee felt as a participating society we should have some influence on policy.

18) A committee on rheological nomenclature will be appointed by the President.

19) The British Society of Rheology has conducted a survey of rheological work and made a report. The feasibility of such a survey in the United States will be investigated by E. A. Collins.

20) The Society of Rheology representative to the International Committee on Rheology is R. S. Marvin.

21 A new membership chairman will be appointed and asked to devise a plan to keep retired members on the list perhaps to receive only the Bulletin.

22) The meeting was adjourned 3:30 p.m.

SYMPOSIUM ON FLOW — ITS MEASUREMENT AND CONTROL IN SCIENCE AND INDUSTRY

The 1971 Flow Symposium, jointly sponsored by American Institute of Physics, American Society of Mechanical Engineers, Instrument Society of America and the National Bureau of Standards, will be presented at the William Penn Hotel, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, from May 10 to 14. Emphasis will be placed on the following themes: Flow Characteristics, (e.g., Non-Newtonian Flow), Flow Measuring Devices, Flow Measurement and Control Techniques, and Biological Fluid Flows, (e.g., Rheological properties of blood).
