Acceptance will be based on technical content and relevance to rheology but without regard to the specific topic. While each Abstract will be judged on an individual basis, those contributors who choose to submit more than one paper should bear in mind the exigencies of program scheduling.

Invited lectures will be given on topics of broad general interest to the Society. These will be announced in the next bulletin.

## BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH OF PROFESSOR ALAN N. GENT

Dr. Alan N. Gent, Bingham Medalist for 1975, is currently Professor of Physics and Assistant Director of the Institute of Polymer Science at the University of Akron. From the University of London, he received a B. Sc. degrees in physics and mathematics and, in 1955, the Ph. D. degree for a study of the mechanics of rubberlike materials, carried out at the British Rubber Producers' Research Association where he held positions between 1949 and 1961. In 1961, he accepted a professorship at the University of Akron and was appointed Assistant Director of the Institute of Polymer Science in 1963. During the 1969-1970 academic year, he was a visiting professor at Queen Mary College in London and a Senior Research Fellow of the Science Research Council of Great Britian.

Professor Gent has made many noteworthy contributions to the science and technology of rubber and allied materials. He has investigated mechanisms of cohesive fracture; elastic, thermoelastic properties; strain-induced crystallization; the effect of ozone on surface cracking; crack growth in elastomers under deformation; friction and wear; birefringence; the nucleation and growth of gas bubbles in elastomers; and the properties of foamed materials.

Dr. Gent is a Fellow of the American Physical Society. He has served as chairman of the Gordon Research Conference on Elastomers and the Gordon Research Conference on the Chemistry and Physics of Cellular Materials. In 1964, he and A. G. Thomas received the First Mobay Award of the Society of the Plastics Industry for their work on cellular materials.

## VIIth INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS ON RHEOLOGY

AUGUST 23 - 27, 1976 CHALMERS UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY GOTHENBURG, SWEDEN

The Swedish Society of Rheology, a section of the Swedish National Committee for Mechanics, will act as the host organization. All aspects of rheology are within the scope of the Congress. Contributions that aim at a reduction of the diversity of the theoretical and empirical framework by introducing new unifying concepts will be especially welcome.

Contributed Papers: Participants intending to contribute papers are asked to give the title and a summary (maximum 300 words) with the preregistration form which should be returned before October 1, 1975.

Registration Fee: A registration fee of 500 Skr will be charged; this includes participation in the scientific sessions and the social functions, and a copy of the Congress Proceedings. The Congress banquet is not included.

Exhibition: During the Congress, there will be an exhibition of rheological measuring devices and related equipment.

## MINUTES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

MARCH 9, 1975

KENT STATE UNIVERSITY, KENT, OHIO

Executive Committee members present: E. A. Collins, J. R. Knox, I. M. Krieger, R. A. Mendelson, R. R. Myers. R. S. Rivlin; also present: A. N. Gent. The meeting was called to order at 10:45 a.m. by the Vice President and was shortly thereafter chaired by the President.

1. Minutes of the October 20, 1974 Executive Committee

meeting were approved as submitted.

2. It was moved, seconded and approved that registration fees for the 1975 Annual Meeting in St. Louis be set as follows: member registration \$20, non-member registration \$30.

3. R. S. Rivlin presented a new listing of committee appointments, and several corrections were noted.

4. E. A. Collins presented the Treasurer's Report, which consisted of the IRS Forms, the Society's financial statements, and financial records concerning the publication of the Trans. Soc. Rheol. These are reported separately by the Treasurer. Discussion of publications finances was continued in the Editor's Report.

The Treasurer's Report was accepted.

- 5. R. R. Myers presented the Editor's Report. A new proposal for publication of Trans Soc. Rheol. has been received from John Wiley & Sons. Three options were presented: (1) publication from cameraready copy at some savings from current costs, (2) cold type printing with unjustified right hand margins (similar to appearance of Polymer Letters, but with current quality paper) at current costs, and (3) current quality (hot metal) publication at increase cost, i.e., doubling subscription charge from \$0.003 to \$0.006 per page and increasing page charge basis from \$15 to \$18. Wiley further represented that the non-member subscription list has been developed at Wiley's expense and would remain with Wiley in the event the Society chooses to change publishers. It was pointed out that the current \$10 dues entitles members to a \$45 publication, that this is probably the best bargain available in scientific journals, and that this is largely responsible for the financial problems arising from increased costs of publications. The Editor's Report was accepted.
- 6. It was moved, seconded and passed that the Society accept the second option presented by John Wiley

(i.e., cold type and unjustified right margin at current cost schedule) and negotiate a three-year contractual agreement on that basis. It was further suggested that possible advertising options be investigated with a view to reducing author page charges.

7. It was reported by R. S. Rivlin that the program for the U.S. - Japan Joint Meeting in Hawaii, June 3-6, 1975, is in hand and will be published in the forthcoming issue of Bulletin. The Local Arrangements Chairman was instructed to make arrangements based on the registration fees, but without deficit to

the treasury.

8. A. N. Gent reported on the Program Committee activity for the 1975 Annual Meeting at the Chase Park Plaza in St. Louis, Oct. 27-30, 1975. A call for papers is being issued with a deadline for abstract submission of July 12, 1975. Rivlin reported that C. T. Hill would handle local arrangements.

9. The report of the Ad Hoc Committee on Program

Guidelines was accepted.

10. The proposal of AIP for printing of a new membership directory was discussed. It was moved, seconded and passed that an expenditure up to \$800 be authorized for a new membership directory with the selection of format to be made by the Secretary, subject to lower cost proposals.

11. A resolution was passed to extend the official condolences of the Society to the family of Professor

Samuel H. Maron.

- 12. A resolution was passed to extend congratulations to Dr. Maurice Huggins on the occasion of his receipt of the Borden Award of the Organic Coatings and Plastics Division of ACS and of his receipt of an honorary D.Sc. from Kent State University.
- 13. Discussion of a 1976 Winter Meeting indicated that selection of the week of January 25 would be necessary to avoid conflict with other West Coast meetings. The meeting will probably be held at the Jack Tar Hotel in San Francisco.
- 14. R. S. Marvin, President of the International Committee on Rheology, has appointed R. S. Rivlin as representative to IUTAM.
- 15. The meeting was adjourned at 5:00 p.m.
